






COMPUTER LAB

Future development will be made possible through virtual technologies. The use of the internet and the availability of many research initiatives or studies will change how the medical community operates. The nursing profession benefits greatly from the use of technology; this includes the monitoring of patient profiles, patient interactions, database management, care delivery patient counseling, billing, and purchasing. The labs at Narayana College of Nursing are well-kept, internet-enabled, and networked with authorized software programs. Another required service is the availability of Wi-Fi, allowing students to complete projects and learn programming without being restricted to computer laboratories for their daily technological needs. The computer lab is always connected to the internet.



MEDICINAL PLANTATION



Long before the prehistoric era, people employed plants for medical purposes. There is evidence that around 4000 years ago, Unani Hakims, Indian Vaidas, and cultures from the Mediterranean and Europe used herbs as medicine. Herbs were employed in healing rituals by indigenous societies in Rome, Egypt, Iran, Africa, and America, while other cultures formed traditional medical systems like Unani, Ayurveda, and Chinese Medicine that systematically utilized herbal remedies. The garden is well-maintained. According to the curriculum, the students visit, care for, and expand upon the garden. A reporting Committee has been constituted in the college and a complaint box also kept to address any complaints from the students and takes necessary action. College has a zero tolerance policy towards any such transgression. The college is providing a safe and conducive work and academic environment to students and its employees and is extremely alert to matters pertaining to any kind of harassment and gender sensitivity. High security system is implemented in the campus by allotting four shifts for the securities by the security agency. CCTV cameras are kept in all lecture halls, Labs and corridors in the college campus. Each floor of hostel is allotted for a warden in one-to-one basis and sick room also supervised by a special duty warden. Outing from the hostel is permitted only with the parents and hostel will be closed at 10 pm with attendance every day to make sure the safety of the students. Anti-ragging Committee is formed as per the U.G.C. guidelines. Every year the students at the entry level sign an

affidavit and submit to the AISHE about non- involvement in ragging activities. Following that counseling regarding ragging conduct for both students and parents. Anti-ragging Committee and Squads carry out rounds in the hostel as well as mess, where the students will group together. They make sure that there are no instances of ragging anywhere in the hostel or anywhere in the campus. Anti-ragging posters are prominently displayed at all prominent places within the Campus. Every day hostel rounds by the squad also makes sure the student's safety and comfort. Main gates are guarded and entry points are screened.

REPORT ON “CYBER CRIME” 10.12.2024

A Gender Sensitization Program on “Cyber Crime” was conducted on 10th December 2024 at NCON in the 2nd floor smart classroom. The program was attended by 75 faculty and non-teaching staff and coordinated by Mrs. T. Lalitha Kumari, Associate Professor. The NSS unit, along with the management, faculty, and III Semester B.Sc. (N) & M.Sc. (N) students of Narayana College of Nursing, actively participated in the Pulse Polio Programme at Narayana Medical College & Hospital. Nursing students assisted in administering oral polio vaccines, setting up booths, conducting door-to-door immunization, and raising awareness among parents. A pre-test and post-test assessment measured awareness levels among 42 participants. In the pre-test, only 7.12% of participants had A+ grade knowledge, 4.76% had A grade knowledge, 14.28% had B+ grade knowledge, 19.04% had B grade knowledge, 30.95% had C grade knowledge, and 23.80% had D grade knowledge. However, after the awareness sessions, the post-test results showed a significant improvement, with 33.33% achieving A+ grade knowledge, 30.95% reaching A grade, 21.42% attaining B+ grade, while only 4.76% remained in B, C, and D grades. The program successfully increased immunization coverage and contributed to polio eradication efforts, emphasizing the importance of collaborative healthcare initiatives.



WORLD HYPER TENSION DAY, 17th MAY, 2024

Theme: "Measure Your Blood Pressure Accurately, Control It, Live Longer".

The NSS Unit of Narayana College of Nursing, in collaboration with Narayana Medical College and Hospital, organized a World Hypertension Day Rally on 17.3.2024, to raise awareness about hypertension and its prevention. The event was inaugurated with a welcome address by the Principal of Narayana Medical College, followed by speeches from healthcare professionals emphasizing the importance of hypertension control. 




WORLD NO TOBACCO DAY, 31ST MAY, 2024

Theme: "Protecting Children from Tobacco Industry Interference"





healthcare services, and an interactive session allowed community members to engage actively. The program concluded with refreshments and a vote of thanks, appreciating the contributions of all participants.




78th INDEPENDENCE DAY – 2024

The NSS unit of Narayana College of Nursing organized a World Cancer Day




REPORT ON “ELIMINATION OF DISCRIMINATION OF WOMEN” 17.09.2024






World Alzheimer's Day



Conclusion

The findings of the pre-test and post-test clearly demonstrate a substantial improvement in the knowledge levels of nursing participants following the intervention aligned with the theme **“Navigating the Landscape of Nursing: Innovations, Challenges, and Future Directions.”** Initially, a considerable proportion of participants (34.7%) fell under the below-average knowledge category, reflecting existing gaps in understanding contemporary nursing concepts and practices. However, after exposure to innovative educational strategies and discussions addressing current challenges and future directions in nursing, this proportion markedly declined to 5.8%. Simultaneously, there was a significant rise in the above-average knowledge group from 19.3% in the pre-test to 54% in the post-test, indicating enhanced comprehension, critical thinking, and readiness to adapt to evolving healthcare demands.

Overall, the shift in knowledge distribution highlights the effectiveness of focused educational interventions in empowering nurses with updated knowledge and competencies. The results underscore the importance of continuous professional development to equip nurses to navigate innovations, overcome challenges, and actively contribute to the future advancement of the nursing profession.
